Lynn, who joined Abbey Vets 19 years ago, attended lectures in Swindon and produced written case studies, assignments, reports and a final exam to gain the Certificate in Business Development. As well as being Head Nurse, Lynn has also now become Practice Co-ordinator.

Gemma, who has worked here for 11 years, gained her Certificate in Emergency and Critical Care after a one-and-a-half-year course,

studying 18 units and completing 18 assignments.

Claire, who joined us five years ago, completed a year-long course to gain the Certificate in Anaesthesia. It involved eight days of teaching by international specialists in anaesthesia, and she also had to produce case studies, reports and a final exam.

Ruth, who has been with us for 17 years, took an 18-month home study course, with two exams and a practical, to gain the Certificate in Small Animal Nutrition.
